

## REGULAR MEETING

July 20, 2009

A regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Busti was held on July 20, 2009 at 6:45 p.m., at the Town Administration Building, 121 Chautauqua Avenue, Lakewood, New York with the following members present:

Supervisor Sullivan called the meeting to order with the salute to the flag and a moment of silence was observed.

Bentley.

Joseph Hoose on behalf of the Southwestern Soccer Club appeared before the board on safety issues for parking at Loomis Park during events held at the park. Highway Superintendent Melvin J. Peterson stated the parking lot will be paved in the near future which will help with the parking issues. Mr. Hoose thanked Highway Superintendent Melvin J. Peterson for replacing the fence post at the park.

Dan Butera appeared before the board regarding a proposal in 1989-1990 for a retention pond on South Avenue. This has been referred to Councilman Hajdu and Highway Superintendent Melvin J. Peterson for review.

Shawn Sanders, 322 Maplecrest Avenue requested the board on how to proceed to have the road paved in front of his house. The town is waiting for the necessary paperwork for the town to accept the road.

Lakewood-Busti Police Chief John R. Bentley reported 5,400 incidents to date.

Highway Superintendent Melvin J. Peterson reported that his department worked with the Village of Lakewood paving nine streets in the village.

Gary Melquist on behalf of the residents of Park Meadow Drive subdivision requested the board not to allow the Family Church of the Southern Tier, 3130 Garfield Road, to hook into their water and sewer lines because of the number of parishioners of the church and the age of the equipment/lines to handle the increase usage. The town will notify the residents if a proposal comes from the church to proceed with allowing them to hook into their line.

Supervisor Sullivan offered the following motion which was duly seconded by Councilman Hazzard:

RESOLVED, that payment be made to LW Parker Enterprises, Inc. in the amount of \$15,960 for the Loomis Park improvements.

RESOLVED, that Supervisor Sullivan be authorized and directed to pay the presented General Fund, Highway Fund, Joint Recreation Fund and the Hazeltine Public Library for Abstract No. 13 from warrant #524 to and including #564 the amount of \$113,908.82.
